






ELENA BURYKINA


ALEX PAUL LOZA



Brett Weaver is a contemporary American impressionist who currently works and resides in Chattanooga, Tennessee with his wife and their twin children. Growing up in rural Tennessee, where his early childhood influences included faith, farming, engineering, and his family's small-town country store, taught him to see the value of people, family, community, and the beauty of the world around him. Brett's work offers a genre of visual poetry spoken through expressive shapes and layers of pigment to interpret and respond to his subject, or lack thereof. His work relies more on design than subject matter, allowing for freedom and diversity ranging from traditional landscapes to abstract expressionism.

As we began to dream of a new permanent home for TRGT, we envisioned what the building would look like inside. We visualized a space that would communicate our core mission while capturing the truly special places throughout the Tennessee River Gorge.

Since 2019, we have worked with many local visual artists to help us capture the essence of the gorge by creating original artwork for our annual fundraiser. Artwork can describe, transport us to, and capture the beauty of the gorge in ways that words or photos sometimes do not.

We have commissioned two internationally-recognized and highly-collectable Chattanooga painters to create artwork for the permanent collection in our new headquarters. Both artists are longstanding partners of TRGT who have created many pieces inspired by the gorge.

These large-format paintings on the following two pages—each valued at \$10,000—will hang prominently in our Hampton Board Room.

I always wanted to paint The Gorge in super-vibrant fall colors. When this opportunity came along, I immediately asked Rick to take me to help me find the spot to make this piece. The forest is beautiful, rugged and raw, just as nature should be. But passing through some of the forest is difficult going. I wanted the composition to include the brush, thorns and whatever is in the way, to then open onto one of the most beautiful places I have ever seen. Just as it takes your organization a significant amount of work through tasks to get to where Tennessee River Gorge Trust is going. The reward awaits in the distance.

Timur Akhriev lived with his family in Vladikavkaz, the territory where southern Russia meets Chechnya, until moving from the region during the conflict of 1991. He attended the St. Petersburg loganson Fine Art School at the age of 12, and later, the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga in the Fine Arts Program. His early career efforts were primarily objective observations of the world through still life and plein air painting, moving towards a more symbolic visual practice, but still using the vocabulary of Realism.

My piece depicts the sun about to set on Aetna Mountain. When I visited, there were Giant Plume Grasses blooming and catching the last light. In every shadow, I wondered if I would see a secret happening- maybe the quick silhouette of a deer, or coyotes about to sing their dusk songs before the long night.

Mia Bergeron'is a representational painter originally from New York City, but who now considers Chattanooga her home. Bergeron studied at the Rhode Island School of Design, but left to pursue a more traditional education at the Charles H. Cecil Studio in Florence, Italy in 2002. Her work is featured in collections in the United States and Europe, including the Bennett Collection and the New Salem Museum. In 2022 her painting "Tranquil Ghosts" was featured on the cover of American Art Collector Magazine. In January 2024, her painting was featured in the fiction section of *The New Yorker Magazine*.
